Key Issues:

What top three points can you distill from community input to take to DFO RHQ?

1. Still the who to call when. Must get this on the SEP workshop schedule . C&P came to Bowen and were a big hit. How to report and to whom do we report. People calling Streamkeepers as to logging right to rivers edge and bring up drinking water issues. Callers want to know the name of local streamkeepers to call, these are hard" cold calls" to get when groups and individuals are fully subscribed. We need to ensure the correct agencies are receiving and working on the issues arising from community. Hazardous waste proposal on the Fraser should be covered by DFO and EC as there are other places to put the facility rather then directly on this amazing waterway, this should be a no brainer but instead groups are being kept busy fighting this. What permits would be needed by the people proposing this site? What safe guards are in place, do we as citizens really have to learn all the policy, process and protocols? Each time "we" do the processe and is working to ensure the best outcomes for the environment?

- Lots of interest in data by agencies but they are having troubles finding it. Environment Canada is latest to take interest. Would love to train the CAs in data entry. If your group has collected data please get it into a format where it can be found online and shared. Data in boxes under your desk is still not helping the environment.
- 3. Went to Vancouver ISMP meeting only 5 of us in attendance. Streamkeepers groups and monitoring protocols are ideal to be directly embedded into the ISMP process. I will be presenting on how this can be done well at the SEP Community Workshop 2015 may 15-17 In the process of setting times with groups to work one on one with them for 2015 workplan.

SEP broke new ground when it was launched in 1977 by working closely with citizens and schools to raise awareness of salmon conservation and to carry out hands-on community salmon enhancement and stewardship projects. Three of the program's main activities are: Hatcheries, Resource Restoration, Stewardship and Education.
