Key Issues:

What top three points can you distill from community input to take to DFO RHQ?

- 1. Lack of ability to hire permanent community advisors from vacant positions
- 2. Lack of assuredness that the fisheries act is able to assist in protection. Some muni staff wanting to set new more stringent rules in light of "loss of Fisheries Act" while those who can actually make decisions on land use think they know the latest rules or lack thereof and are pushing forward
- 3. SEP community workshop 2015. Local community input, DFO expertise as to sector, CA all in and now we can work at ensuring Province wide perspective with lots of local examples. DFO teaching time for protocols and programs. New travel protocols for departmental staff

Stories:

Was just at the Living Waters Rally in Ottawa – point that struck me was that on Friday morning on TV the Association of Mines was meeting with Senate committee to discuss their need for changes to the assessment process while the NGO's were talking to each other. At the end of the senate discussion one senator asked the association if they wanted anything else changed. How can water and habitat get a fairer shake at having changes be to the positive side of protection. Streamlining of process is great IF the outcome of protection still occurs.

gathered using Streamkeepers Module 1,2,3 and 4 can inform the ISMP planning process. This included a public engagement project that Evergreen staff attended from this Evergreen has determined to work with Streamkeepers to have their citizen science project "uncover your Creeks" use the DFO Streamkeepers protocols with training for community. They can then use the PSkF database to store and share their information.

We continue to expand on the Streamkeepers database we can now align photos from the features mapped during Module 1 mapping. There has been refinements such as on Model 12 on the reports page you can now get a summary of how many live / dead you found each survey date. Databases seems to come with bugs :>) the difference with ours is that the author of the program still works alongside us to make it right and make it work. I shared some ways streamkeeper groups are sharing their data and we are working on the reporting section next.

If you haven't subscribed to our Streamkeepers online messageboard I will again suggest you do so. This board is populated by a number fo people and can get out some great info.
