Recommendations

- **1** The following over-arching recommendations will, if accepted and implemented, determine the Department's genuine commitment to meet the stated goals of the Wild Salmon Policy.
 - (a) Make policy happen, don't just write it
 - (b) Act in the absence of all information
 - (c) Define roles for partners (All levels of government, community, First Nations)
 - (d) Demonstrate leadership
 - (e) Stay engaged in an integrated effort
 - (f) Enforce the mandate
 - (g) Build a conservation ethic
- **2** Infusion of badly needed resources should be guided by the following to maximize the number of tools available for the Department and its community partners:
 - (a) Resources
 - i) Fund the mandate
 - ii) Enable a substantial increase in A-based funding:

For assessment and enforc ement

To empower the community as a viable partner

In general, to staff resource s on the ground (Not Regional Headquarters or Area Management offices)

To the entire DFO pie (Do not rob Peter to pay Paul)

- (b) Priority areas on the ground
 - i) Riparian protection
 - ii) Strategic enhancement
 - iii) Habitat restoration, maintenance and protection
- (c) Design principles
 - i) Identify core values through public consultation
 - ii) Identify the community's agenda
 - iii) Share the data
 - iv) Fill information gaps prior to making decisions on CU's, etc.
 - v) Design a deliverable, measurable action plan (Goals, dates, etc.)
 - vi) Establish comprehensive indicators
